




Western Conference and Districts



The annual Western Conference Cross County Meet was run at Deer Run Park, here in Sidney. The Raiders ran a solid meet, beating Gering by nine points and claiming the Western Conference title. Collin Brauer ('19) led the way, placing first overall. Junior Lucero ('19) placed 5th, Kaden Vowers ('18) 7th, Jacob Peckham ('20) 12th, Colton Peckham ('18) 15th and Caedon Snider ('19) 17th. The Lady Raiders had a very good showing as well. They placed second as a team with the following individual performances: Charlie Brockhaus ('18) 8th, Taighlor Arnett ('20) 5th, Miranda Ahrendt ('21) 14th, Hannah Kennedy ('19) 15th, Kylie Rosdail ('18) 19th, and Emma Tuzicka ('18) 20th. It was a great day for both boys and girls cross country teams.

The State Cross Country Meet took place on October, 20, in Kearney, and the Raiders had eight runners competing in the meet. Charlie Brockhaus ('18) ran the 5k course in 22 minutes 20 seconds and Taighlor Arnett ('20) finished in 22 minutes 6 seconds. The boys team ran a tough race, as windy conditions were worse than when the girls ran. Collin Brauer ('19) led the way for the Raiders placing 11th, followed by Junior Lucero ('19) in 21st, Kaden Vowers ('18) 46th, Caedon Snider ('19) 70th, Jacob Peckham ('20) 81st, and Mitch Porter ('18) 83rd. The boys placed 8th overall as team. with the highly selective All State Choir. They received superior ratings at districts and have been invited to perform in New York in April of 2019.











Working Perks
