The State Cross Country Meet took place on October, 20, in Kearney, and the Raiders had eight runners competing in the meet. Charlie Brockhaus ('18) ran the 5 k course in 22 minutes 20 seconds and Taighlor Arnett ('20) finished in 22 minutes 6 seconds. The boys team ran a tough race, as windy conditions were worse than when the girls ran. Collin Brauer ('19) led the way for the Raiders placing 11th, followed by Junior Lucero ('19) in 21st, Kaden Vowers ('18) 46th, Caedon Snider ('19) 70th, Jacob Peckham ('20) 81st, and Mitch Porter ('18) 83rd. The boys placed 8th overall as team. Head Coach Weideburg was very pleased with her team and felt very good as the both girls and boys improved throughout the season and performed well at the state meet.



The Lady Raiders finished with winning seasons at all three levels of play. Varsity won the majority of their matches for the regular season and came out of Western Conference as champions. They lost in the first round of Sub Districts to Gering, but were awarded a wildcard to play Elkhorn South in the District Finals. After losing

The team was very motivated and had a strong work ethic, giving the coaches a very good base to work with. The young men exhibited great strength throughout the season and continued to improve through districts and state. The Sidney wrestlers swept districts, taking home the title for the first time since 1995, with district champions being Kaden Vowers ('18), Trey Arellano ('19), K.C. Higer ('19), and Derek Robb ('18). Coach Ganser was voted Coach of the Year at the district tournament. The wrestlers were also able to put up a fight at the NSAA State Wrestling Tournament, bringing home four medals, while also qualifying for the State Dual tournament. Brody Raines ('20) took home 5th, Kaden Vowers ('18) 2nd, but here in Sidney he's the people's champion, and Trey Arellano ('19) and Derek Robb ('18) both brought home state titles. This is a huge accomplishment for Derek, making him the first Raider in school history to win four state titles. He also won the Omaha World Herald Class B Wrestler of the Year award with a 61-0 season. Finally, Coach Ganser announced his retirement after 41 years of teaching, coaching, and mentoring students and athletes alike. All in all, it was an extremely successful season for the wrestlers.
