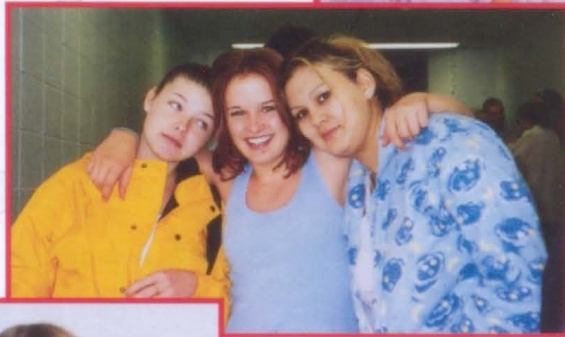

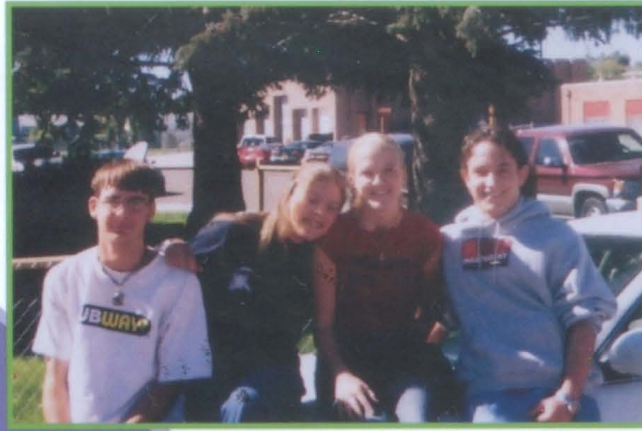

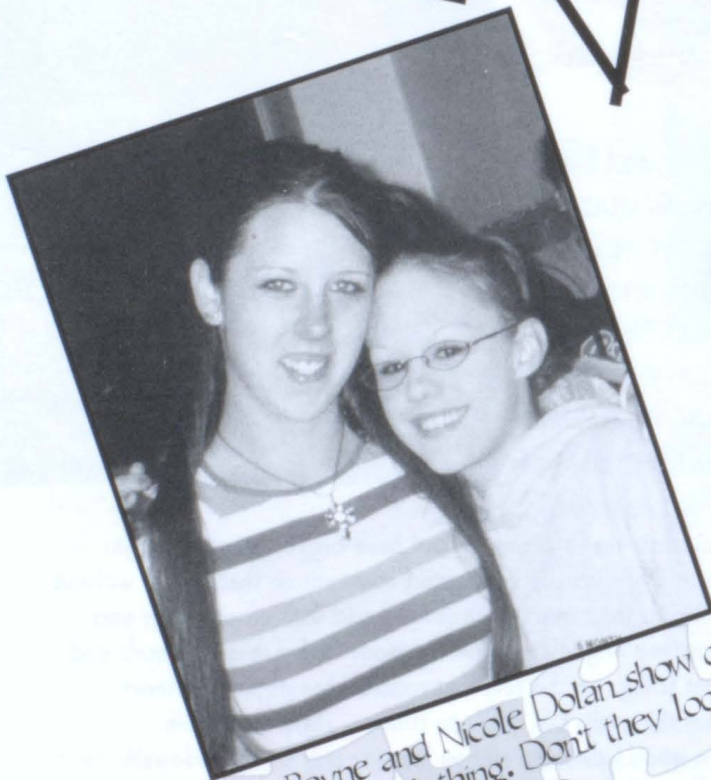

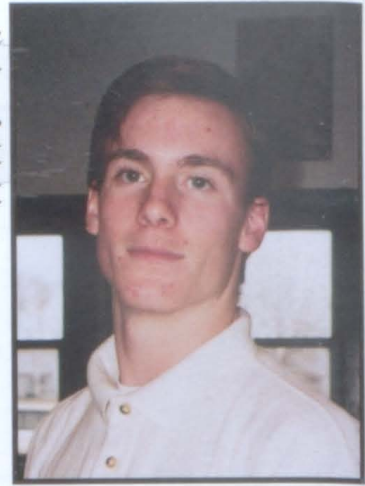

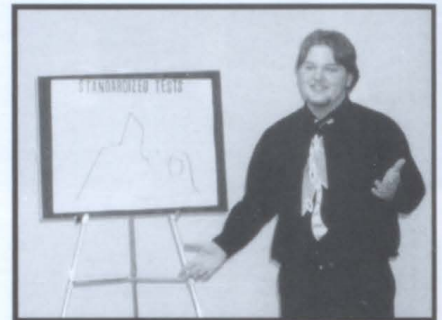

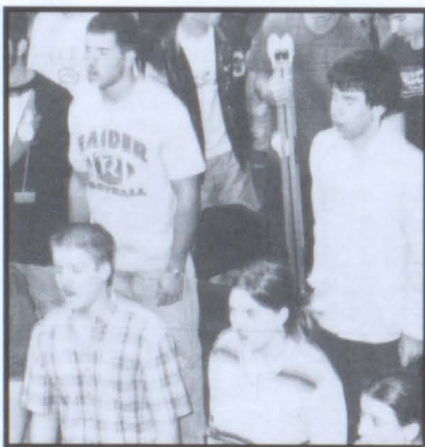

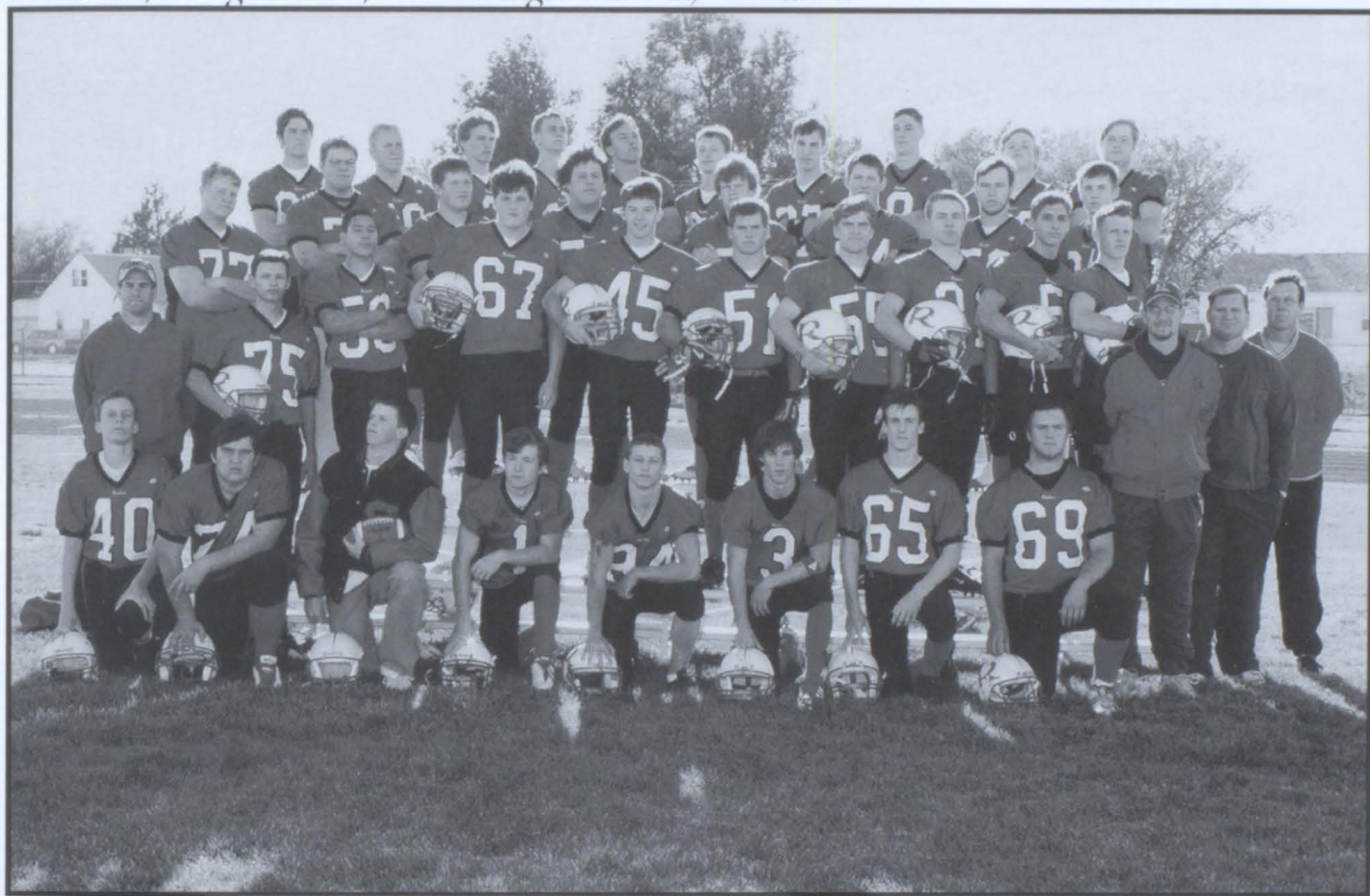

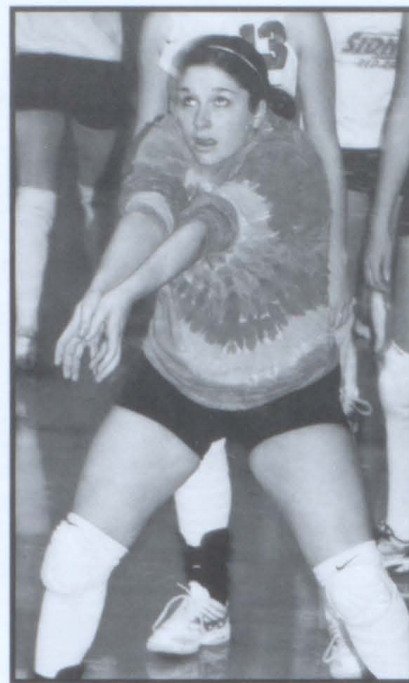

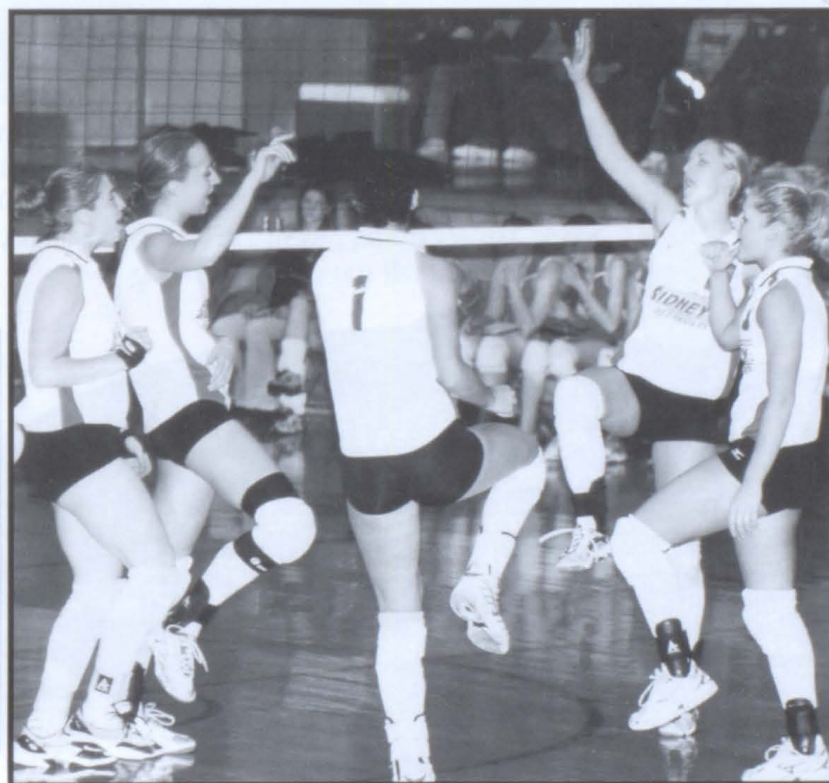

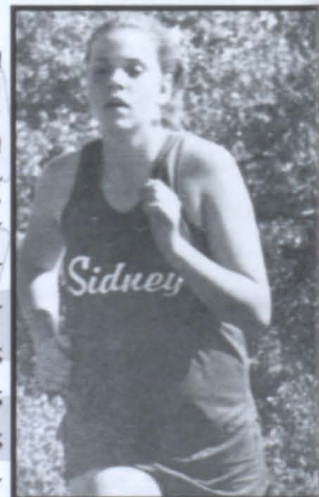

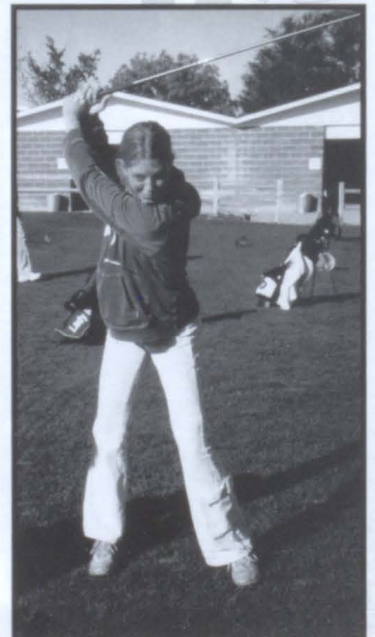

Overall the varsity team ended there season with a dual of five wins and three losses.



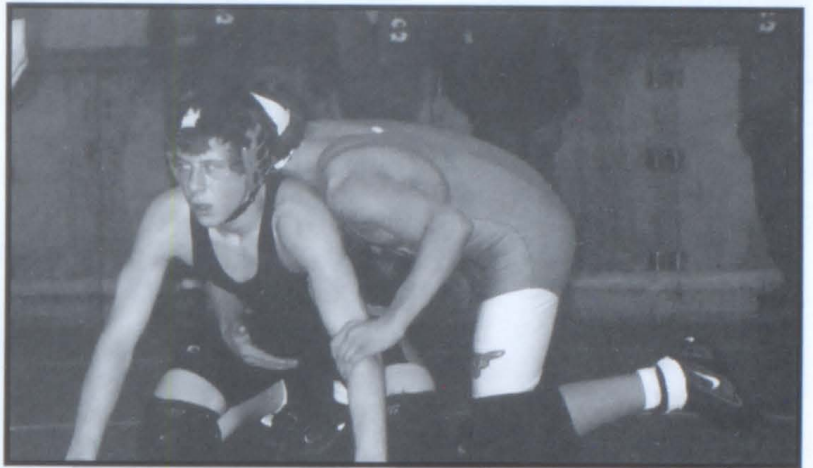

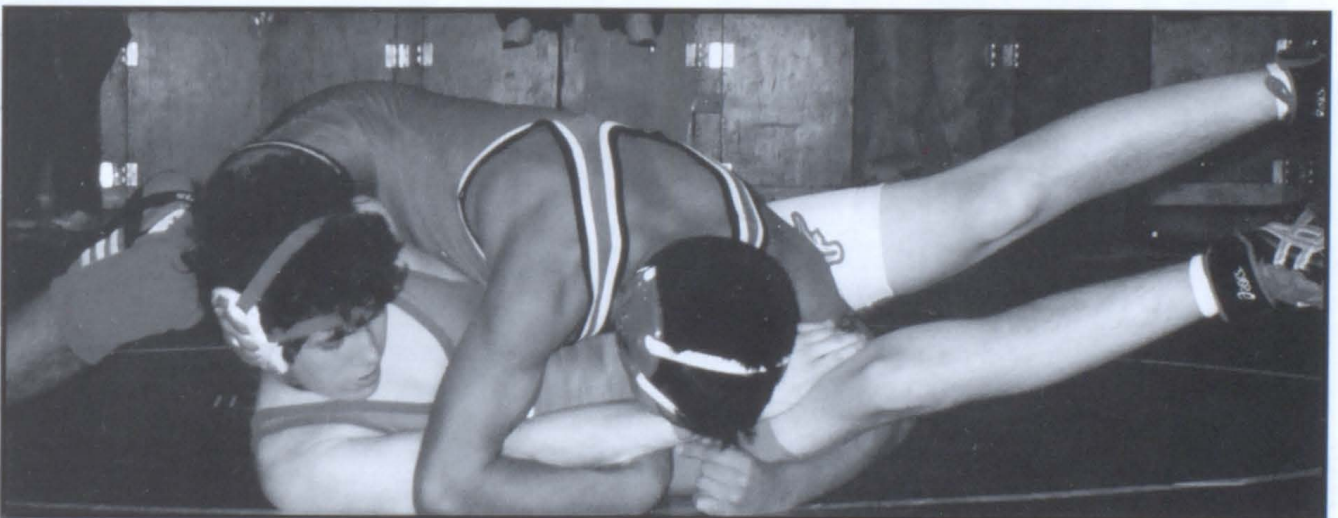
