## Drunk Driving Statistics

-An average of eight teens died every day from drunk driving in 1996. $-21 \%$ of teen drivers involved in fatal crashes had been drinking in 1997.
-Alcohol use is the number one drug problem among teens.
-2.6 million teens don't know a person can die from alcohol overdose. -During a typical weekend, an average of one teen dies an hour in a car crash. Nearly $50 \%$ of those crashes involved alcohol.
-In the past decade alone, drunk driving has killed more than four times as many people as the Vietnam war.
$-297,000$ people are injured in drunk driving accidents per year. That's one every two minutes.
-Teen drivers make up $6.7 \%$ of the total driving population, but constitute $13 \%$ of the alcohol-involved drivers in fatal crashes.
$-57.3 \%$ of the fatally injured teen drivers per year are intoxicated.
