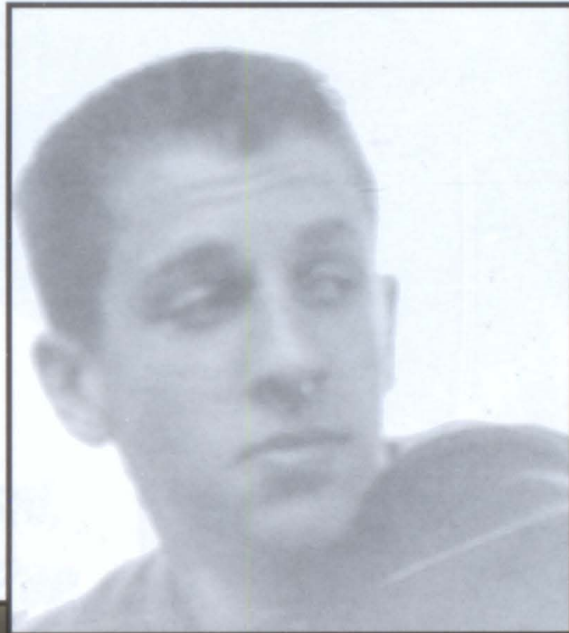

Vera plans on returning to Africa this summer after her senior year to continue doing her mission work in Botswana.

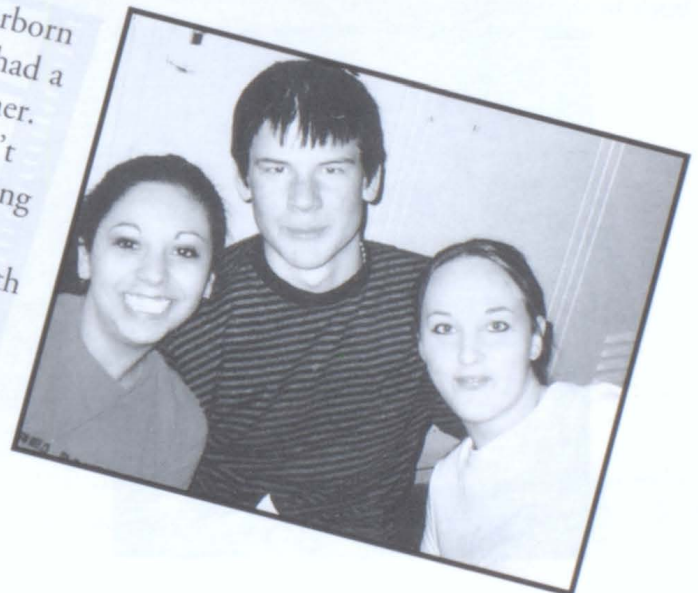

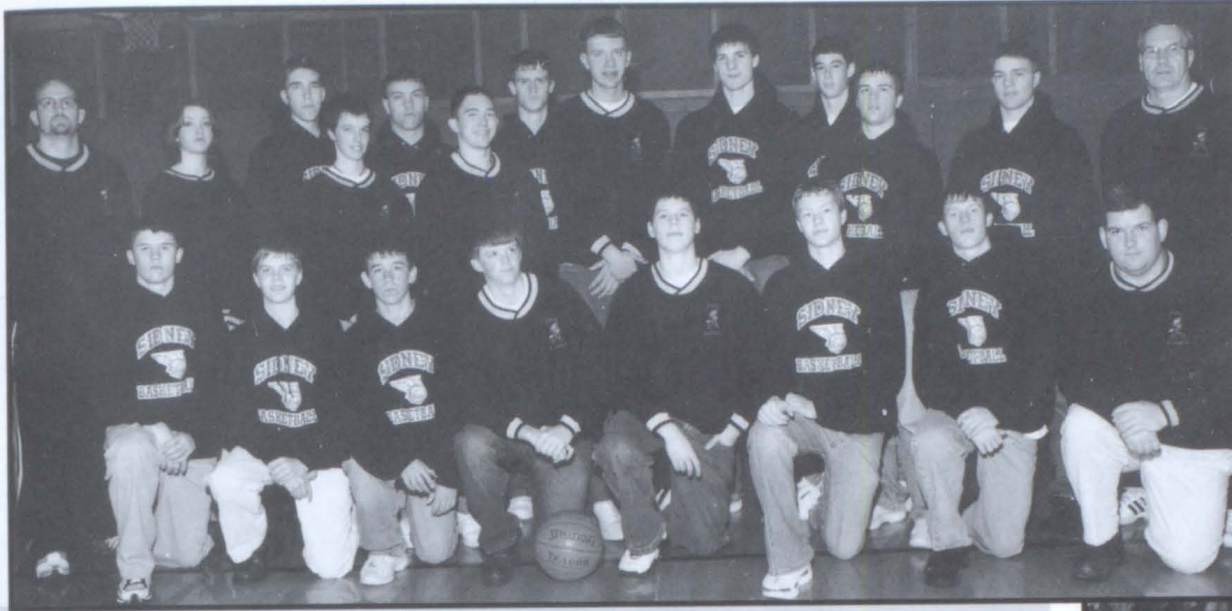

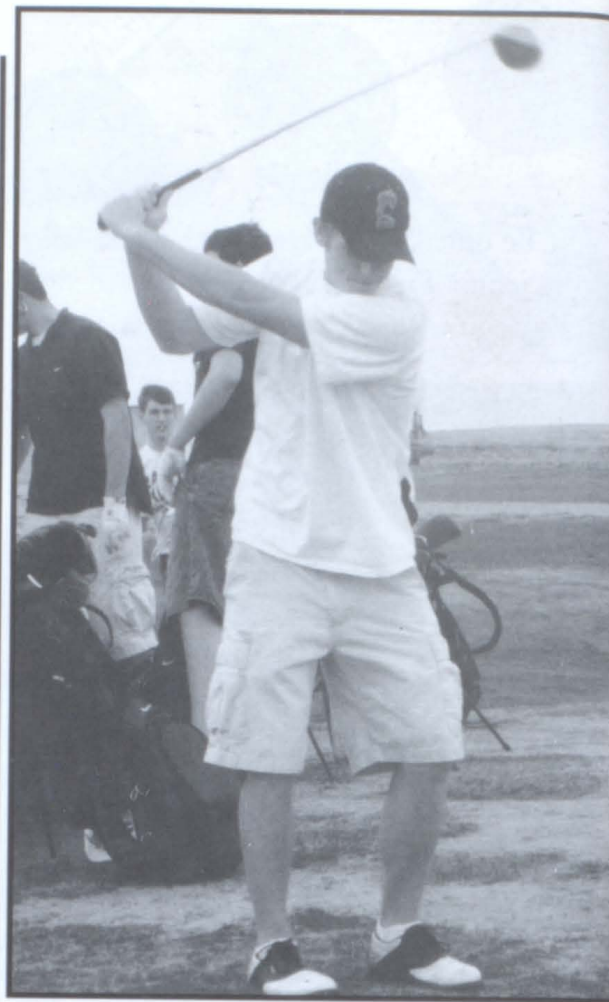

Over the years we have seen the band grow to be a very unique and talented group. Some may say it's magic and some may say it's the teacher.

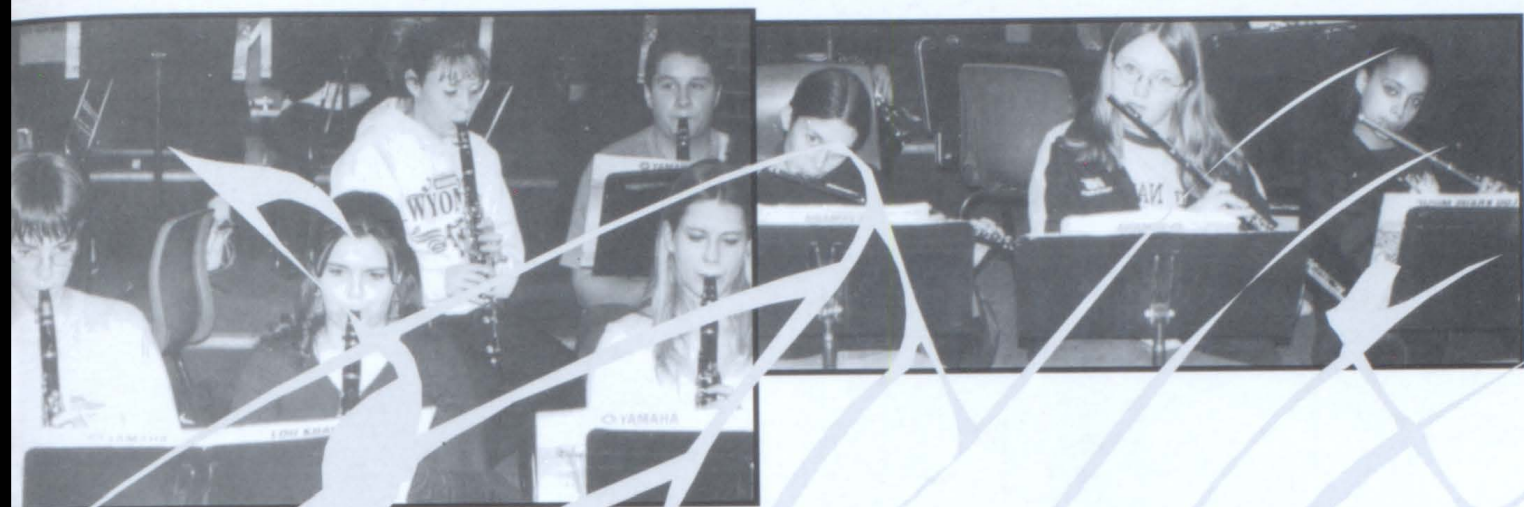
